- The Board met at 0930, January 4, 1943, in Room 2716, Navy Department.

- In reference (a), Commander Service Squadron, South Pacific, recommended the acquisition of the Tanker J. C. DONNELL. In reference (b) the Commander-in-Chief, Pacific Fleet, concurred in that recommendation.
- The Board is cognizant of the urgent need for additional tankers in the South Pacific area and is of the opinion that the material condition of the J. C. DONNELL warrants her acquisition under a bare boat charter to help meet this need.
- The Board, therefore, recommends that the Tanker, J. C. DONNELL, be acquired at once from the War Shipping Administration

under a bare boat charter; and that the minimum conversion required to provide for Navy crews be accomplished.

- 6. By reference (c), the Board's attention was called to the availability for acquisition of a ferry boat, the S/S TAMALPAIS, and an ex-ferry boat hulk the S/S CAZADERO, to meet an urgent housing need for Naval personnel in the Twelfth Naval District. The Board considers that the most expeditious and economical method of meeting the need for additional housing facilities in that District is by acquiring these two ferry boats which are now in the immediate vicinity of San Francisco Bay.
- 7. The Board is of the further opinion that the material condition of the two boats warrants their purchase in preference to their acquisition by bare boat charter; and, therefore, recommends that Ferry Boat S/S TAMALPATS and ex-Ferry Boat Hulk S/S CAZADERO be purchased by the Navy and that a conversion similar to that of the ex-Fort Sutter (YHB-11) be undertaken to condition the boats as Floating Barracks Ships for Navy personnel.

In reference (a), the Vice Chief of Naval Operations expressed the urgent need for tankers of small draft to distribute petroleum products in the Southwest Pacific area. The reference also requested that the S/S E. R. KEMP be acquired to partially meet this need.

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- the S/S E. R. KEMP, now engaged in coastal trade as a gasoline tanker in the Caribbean, is in good material condition for the proposed employment, and therefore, recommends that the steam tanker S/S E. R. KEMP be acquired by the Navy under a bare boat charter and that a minimum conversion be undertaken to accommodate a Navy crew and to mount additional close-in antiaircraft guns.
- 5. In Auxiliary Vessels Board Report No. 61, the Board recommended that the S/S BRIDGEPORT, which was to be converted to a repair ship by the War Shipping Administration, be acquired by assignment of title and be manned by the Navy.
- by reference (b), that the War Shipping Administration will not convert the S/S BRIDGEPORT to a repair ship because of the long period of time required and the excessive cost of the conversion (\$5,209,000). It is, therefore, recommended that the action of the Board in Report No. 61 be cancelled and that the S/S BRIDGEPORT be not acquired by the Navy.
- 7. In reference (c) the Board recommended that the fifteen (15) Algerine Minesweepers, building in Canada, be acquired by the Navy and converted to small transport vessels. In reference (d), in compliance with a directive of the Commanderin-Chief, the Auxiliary Vessels Board recommended the conversion of the Algerine Minesweepers to cargo vessels be cancelled and that they be completed as minesweepers. In reference (e), the Munitions Assignment Committee (Navy) assigned the Algerine Minesweepers to the British.
- 8. It is, therefore, recommended that these Algerine Minesweepers be deleted as a charge against the auxiliary tonnage authorization and be set up as a charge against the 1799 Ship Program.

In Auxiliary Vessels Board Report No. 51, the Board recommended the acquisition of twenty-four (24) listed Maritime Commission hulls to meet the expanding need for tankers outlined in the report. Twelve (12) of these ships have been assigned to the Navy, but the selection of the remaining twelve was deferred pending a contemplated change in design which has now resulted in an increase in horsepower. It has now been brought to the attention of the Board that nine (9) Maritime Commission hulls of an improved design being built by the Marinship Corporation, Sausalito, California, may be acquired by the Navy without an appreciable delay in delivery dates over the original scheduled deliveries. In order to round out the uniform program of delivery and conversion, three (3) Maritime Commission hulls now building by the Sun Shipbuilding Company, Chester, Pennsylvania, are available for acquisition. It is, therefore, recommended that the tankers listed below be acquired to complete the program of two (2) tankers per month for the current year, making a total OD-23-APC (SC)AA/OB Serial 055823 CONFIDENTIAL

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of twenty-four (24); and that the recommendations of the Board in Auxiliary Vessels Board Report No. 51 be modified accordingly:

- 4. In Auxiliary Vessels Board Report No. 63, the Board recommended that the S/S E. R. KEMP be acquired for use as a tanker. Further inspection has disclosed that the ship is unsuitable for carrying more than one type of fuel cargo, because of the age and poor condition of her tanks. It is considered, therefore, that the vessel is unsuitable for duty intended in the South Pacific area, and it is recommended that the above action of this Board be cancelled and the S/S E. R. KEMP be not acquired.
- In Report No. 42, the Board recommended additional auxiliary vessels for the 1943-1944 building program. These included two Submarine Tenders for 1943 and two Submarine Tenders for 1944. One Submarine Tender of the 1943 program is to be obtained through the conversion of the S/S HAWAIIAN MERCHANT. This ship will start conversion about April 1, 1943. It was planned to build the other Submarine Tender in the 1943 program at the Seattle-Tacoma Shipbuilding Company, interposing it between the 1943 and 1944 Auxiliary Aircraft Carrier building programs at that yard. It has now developed that to build this Submarine Tender at the Seattle-Tacoma yard at that time will materially delay this program. Due to the urgency for additional Auxiliary Aircraft Carriers this delay is not acceptable. As an alternative and in order to meet the program for a total of three additional Submarine Tenders required in the 1943 and 1944 programs, the Board recommends that the following Maritime Commission hulls be acquired; that they be converted to Submarine Tenders; and that they be manned by Navy crews:

6. Further study discloses that by the end of 1944 there will be 188 submarines in service. On the basis of one tender for each twelve submarines, one additional tender over and above those now in commission and the four referred to in the preceding paragraph, will be required. In view of the extended areas of operation of submarines under present war conditions, the Board considers it essential that this additional submarine tender be provided. It is, therefore, recommended that Maritime Commission Hull No. 856, to be built at Ingalls Shipbuilding Corporation (estimated date of delivery November 1, 1943), be acquired by the Navy, converted to a submarine tender and manned by a Navy crew.

7. The Board's attention has been called to the need for additional transportation facilities to care for the ever-growing ferry traffic of Naval personnel between San Francisco and Treasure Island. The Commandant, Twelfth Naval District, has advised that the sidewheel ferry boat TREASURE ISLAND is available and recommends the acquisition of that boat. Investigation discloses that the boat is in reasonably good material condition and will be suitable for the stated purpose. The Board, therefore, recommends that the ferry boat TREASURE ISLAND be acquired by bare boat charter for the Navy.

In reference (a) the Commander-in-Chief, United States Fleet, directed that three (3) additional Provision Storeships be acquired to meet urgent needs in the South Facific area

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and the Auxiliary Vessels Board in Report #59 recommended that Maritime Commission Hulls 183 (BLUE JACKET), 184 (GOLDEN EAGLE), and 185 (TRADE WIND) now building by the Maritime Commission be purchased for Navy use. The Maritime Commission was reluctant to assign these vessels to the Navy and the Commander Service Force, Pacific Fleet, having advised that the MUSA and the PLATANO would be suitable for service in the Pacific, the Vice Chief of Naval Operations proposed that the MUSA and PLATANO be substituted for two of the above-named Maritime Commission Hulls. This was approved by the Commander-in-Chief, United States Fleet, by reference

- The Board, therefore, recommends that the S/S MUSA and the S/S PLATANO be acquired by bare boat charter to replace two of the BLUE JACKET Class vessels and that one of the Maritime Commission Hulls of the BLUE JACKET Class be acquired likewise. It is further recommended that the three vessels acquired be manned by the Navy, that conversions be undertaken to accommodate Navy crews, and that Auxiliary Vessels Board Report #59 be modified accordingly.
- The ten (10) EC-2 type ships recommended for acquisition and conversion by the Auxiliary Vessels Board, in Report #57, have been delivered and assigned to the South Pacific area. By reference (c), the Commandant of the Twelfth Naval District urged the acquisition of eight more ships of this type to meet the expanding needs for additional cargo vessels. The Board considers that the acquisition of additional ships of this type is essential, and therefore, recommends that eight (8) additional EC-2 hulls building in the San Francisco area be acquired by bare boat charter for the Navy for assignment to the Naval Transportation Service; that the acquisitions shall be timed to take delivery of the first ship about March 15, 1943, and remaining deliveries approximately every ten days thereafter, to enable the Bureau of Naval Personnel to man the ships; that a conversion similar to the first ten (10) EC-2 hulls be undertaken to accommodate Naval crews; and that the ships be equipped with an additional boom of 30-ton capacity and towing engines when available.
- In reference (d), the Vice Chief of Naval Operations expressed the urgent need for tankers to distribute petroleum products in the Southwest Pacific area. The Board considers that the tanker

By reference (a) the Commander, South Pacific Fleet, wrged that an additional ten (10) ships of this class be acquired to provide for increased transshipping requirements to advance bases. In reference (b) the Commander-in-Chief, Pacific Fleet, concurred. The Board considers that additional ships of this type

- of additional shallow draft tankers to distribute bulk petroleum products to ports of limited depth. This Board's attention has been directed to three coastwise tankers possessing characteristics suitable for the above service. It is recommended, therefore, that the three coastwise tankers, the M/V ESSO DELIVERY #11, the M/V NEW YORK SOCONY, and the M/V VEEDOL #2 be purchased for the Navy; that they be manned by Navy crews; and that a limited conversion be undertaken to provide crew quarters and an adequate battery.
- 5. Shortly after the occupation of North Africa, a tanker found in one of the ports was taken over by the U. S. Navy, manned by a full Navy crew and has since been in regular operation. It later developed that this vessel, the ex-British Flag Tanker TEMARA, had been lost in the fall of France. It has been suggested by the British Merchant Shipping Mission that this vessel be left with the U. S. Navy under reciprocal aid arrangements. Because of the need expressed in the preceding paragraph, it is recommended that the tanker TEMARA be acquired by bare boat charter from the British Ministry of War Transport through the War Shipping Administration for use by the Navy in North African operations.

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- The Board recommends, therefore, that two EC-2 type cargo ships be acquired by purchase from the Maritime Commission: that they be converted to internal combustion engine repair ships (ARE); and that they be manned by Navy crews.
- In reference (b) the Commandant, Naval Air Training Center, U. S. Naval Air Station, Pensacola, Florida, after a survey by transportation consulting engineers, urged the acquisition of two ferry boats for the transportation of civilian and Naval personnel of the Naval Air Station and the Auxiliary Air Stations forming the Naval Air Training Center, Pensacola, Florida. The Office of Defense Transportation concurs in this recommendation.
- The Board considers that the traffic problems of the Training Center would be solved by the use of two ferry boats; and that two of the ferry boats, RUTHERFORD, GOSHEN, ARLINGTON, TENEFLY, and HACKENSACK, now in the vicinity of New York, would be suitable for the ferry service required.
- It is recommended that the Navy purchase through the War Shipping Administration two of the ferry boats, listed in the preceding paragraph, which are determined by inspection by representatives of the Bureau of Ships to be in the best material condition; and that they be manned by civilian personnel.
- In reference (c) the Commandant, Thirteenth Naval District, points out that the existing need for a combination passenger and cargo vessel in the Alaskan area has become more acute. He recommends the S/S LURLINE BURNS for acquisition to assist in meeting this transportation problem.

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- In reference (a), the Commander-in-Chief, United States Fleet, directed that appropriate action be taken in respect to the salvage tugs RESOLUTE and INTENT, and the salvage vessel W. R. CHAMBERLIN, JR. In reference (b), the Commander United States Naval Forces, Northwest African Waters, advised the suitability of these vessels for service by the Navy in the African area.
- It is recommended, therefore, that the salvage tugs RESOLUTE and INTENT be acquired by the Navy by transfer from the United States Army; that the salvage vessel W. R. CHAMBERLIN, JR. be purchased through the War Shipping Administration; and that all be manned by Navy crews.
- As a result of a casualty in the South Pacific area, the main propulsion plant of the EDGAR ALLEN POE was wrecked and the underwater damage was extensive. The Board considers, however, that the ship, after limited hull and auxiliary machinery repairs and installations, will greatly contribute toward meeting the storage problem in the area. It is recommended, therefore, that the EDGAR ALLEN POE be acquired "as is" by bare boat charter for the Navy, for use as a receiving and storage ship at advance bases in the South Pacific; that the vessel be fitted for that purpose; and that the ship be manned by a Navy crew.
- Because of the wrgent need for tankers and with the approval of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, the Maritime Commission has contracted for the building of twelve (12) Tl-M-Al Maritime Commission Hulls numbered 1520 to 1531, inclusive, at East Coast Shipyards, Incorporated, Bayonne, New Jersey, and twelve (12) Maritime Commission Hulls numbered 1532 to 1543, inclusive, at Gray's Iron Works, Galveston, Texas. 3. In reference (a), the Vice Chief of Naval Operations advised that the President had approved the proposed construction program of combatant ships and authorized the Bureaus to proceed with the construction of

- 1 45,000-ton Aircraft Carrier (CV)
- 3 27,000-ton Aircraft Carriers (CV)
- 1 27,000-ton Large Cruiser (CB)
- 4 Heavy Cruisers (CA)
- 7 Light Cruisers (CL)
- 82 Destroyers (DD)
- 110 Submarines (SS)
- 205 Destroyer Escort Vessels (DE).
- 4. At present the tender shortage for the maintenance of the Fleet is being keenly felt and the number available is far below requirements to maintain the proper ratio of ships to tenders. This new construction program and the increasing need for mobile repair units to support the aviation program, and in particular, the needs of the Fleet Air Base Units (FABUS), Carrier Air Service Units (CASUS), and Patrol Wing Service Units (PATSUS) in advanced areas will necessitate the building or acquisition and conversion of Maritime Commission hulls for additional tenders to take care of the increase in ships and planes.
- 5. The Board has made a thorough study of the facilities available in the next two years and has determined that sixteen (16) large tenders can be built by the Navy during that period. From analysis of the various tender types now in commission, those building and those converting, it is indicated that the sixteen (16) tenders to be built should be distributed among the types as follows, and the Board strongly recommends that the Navy undertake construction of these vessels:
  - 4 Destroyer Tenders (AD) on C-3 Hull design, similar to HAMUL; completion 1st and 2nd quarters of 1945 and 1st and 3rd quarters of 1946.
  - 4 Submarine Tenders (AS) on C-3 Hull design, similar to GRIFFIN; completion 2nd and 4th quarters of 1945 and 2nd and 4th quarters of 1946.
  - 4 Repair Ships (AR) on C-3 Hull design, similar to BRIAREUS; completion 1st and 3rd quarters of 1945 and 1st and 3rd quarters of 1946.
  - 3 Seaplane Tenders (AV) on CURRITUCK design; completion 3rd and 4th quarters of 1945 and 4th quarter of 1946.

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1 Ammunition Ship (AE)

on C-2 Hull design, similar to the MAUNA LOA; completion 2nd quarter of 1946.

6. In addition, Naval construction facilities are available for building a limited number of various smaller types of auxiliary craft. The Board, after careful study of the requirements of the various areas and the numbers of the various smaller types now in commission and building, considers that there are prospective needs for additional numbers in the following types and recommends their construction during the calendar years 1944 and 1945 as a continuing program:

18 Fleet Tugs (AT)(205')

Diesel-driven, standard design; completion and deliveries at the rate of one (1) per month beginning in the 3rd quarter of 1944.

12 Salvage Vessels (ARS)

Steel, standard design; completion and deliveries at the rate of two (2) per quarter beginning in the 3rd quarter of 1944.

12 Gasoline Tankers (AOG)

standard design; completion and deliveries at the rate of two (2) per quarter beginning in the 3rd quarter of 1944.

At present there is no apparent need for additional small seaplane tenders (AVP) nor for submarine rescue vessels (ASR) over and above those on hand and on order, and the Board recommends that construction of these types be not undertaken at this time.

- 7. The Board survey also shows that there is a shortage of adequate Motor Torpedo Boat Tenders (AGP) which are of sufficient size to maintain these boats in efficient operating condition and to house the crews of boats under repair. Larger tenders than those at present available are considered necessary. The Board, therefore, recommends the acquisition of two (2) C-1 type cargo ships for conversion to Motor Torpedo Boat Tenders (AGP). It is estimated that these ships can be acquired from the Maritime Commission and conversion of one completed in the 1st quarter of 1944 and the second completed in the 4th quarter of 1944.
- 8. With the great numbers of ships of all types in the various and extended operating areas, the Board considers that additional repair ships are essential at the earliest practicable date and in planning an auxiliary conversion program for 1944 and 1945, the conversion of IST's and EC-2's to repair ships is the most expeditious and economical method of meeting the maintenance needs.

These converted ships can relieve to a great extent the installation of shore-based repair facilities in the forward operating areas. The Board recommends, therefore, that a program of eight (8) IST conversions a year for the years 1944 and 1945 be undertaken in a program of types which would provide three (3) Battle Damage Repair Ships (ARB), three (3) Landing Craft Repair Ships ARL, and two (2) Motor Torpedo Boat Repair Ships (AGP) per year. Also, it is recommended that a program of twelve (12) EC-2 conversions, six in 1944 and six in 1945, similar to the present conversions of EC-2's to Internal Combustion Engine Repair Ships now under way, be authorized. In order to accommodate the necessary repair force to operate to maximum extent the machine tools placed aboard an EC-2 conversion, the Board further recommends that, for each EC-2 converted to a repair ship, a 2000-ton barge be built and converted to a floating barracks for the repair force personnel assigned to the EC-2. This will permit accommodations for sufficient personnel to fully man the repair facilities on a threeshift basis. These barges are designed and constructed so that 6 01047 they are capable of being moved with or by the EC-2 to which they are assigned and will provide the necessary housing at any location to which the EC-2 may be assigned.

The Board has ascertained that two tankers, the CULTEPPER and the SALVATOR, under allocation from the War Shipping Administration and manned by civilian crews are assigned duties in Iceland. In view of their closely associated duties with the Navy on that station, it is considered desirable that they be manned by Navy crews. The Board, therefore, recommends that they be acquired by the Navy under bare boat charter and that, without any conversion, they be manned by Navy crews.

The Commander Service Force, Pacific Fleet, has requested that the PETER H. BURNETT, a torpedo-damaged Liberty Ship, now at Sydney, Australia, be acquired for use as a floating storage ship in the South Pacific and the Board recommends that the vessel be acquired on bare boat charter for that purpose and manned by a Navy crew.

The Board is cognizant of the urgent need for additional mobile fuel oil storage and to help meet the future requirements for this storage in the Pacific areas, the Board recommends that nine (9) additional concrete fuel-carrying barges (MC Hulls #1228 to #1236, inclusive), building for the Maritime Commission at Concrete Ship Constructors, National City, California, be acquired by purchase for assignment to the Pacific area as mobile fuel storage. .

- 3. The attention of the Board has been called to the availability of Concrete Barge #1 (B7-A2) built for the Maritime Commission at Concrete Ship Constructors, National City, California. The Board recommends that this barge be acquired by purchase, be converted for storage of aviation gas and potable water to meet demands in the South Pacific area, and be Navy manned,
- 4. In Report #65, amended by Reports #67 and #70, the Board recommended the acquisition of three (3) Provision Storeships, one of which was a vessel of the BLUE JACKET Class. The Maritime Commission was reluctant to assign a vessel of the BLUE JACKET Class but has offered a modified C-2 (C2-S-El) dry cargo vessel in its place. The Board considers this design more suitable to help meet the need for service facilities in the South Pacific, and, therefore, recommends that Maritime Commission Hull #481, under construction by the Gulf Shipbuilding Corporation at Chickasaw, Alabama, be purchased by the Navy, converted to a Provision Storeship (AF), and manned by a Navy crew.
- 5. In reference (a) the Commander in Chief, United States Fleet, and Chief of Naval Operations directed the acquisition at the earliest practicable date of one (1) Provision Storeship of suitable characteristics for assignment to the Service Force, Atlantic Fleet. The Board considers Maritime Commission design C2-S-El suitable for the duties contemplated by reference (a), and, therefore, recommends that Maritime Commission Hull #485, under construction by the Gulf Shipbuilding Corporation at Chickasaw, Alabama, be purchased by the Navy, converted to a Provision Storeship (AF), and be manned by a Navy crew. Should the Maritime Commission hulls designated in paragraphs 4 and 5 not be available, it is recommended that similar hulls in the Maritime Commission building program be obtained for this purpose.
- 6. In Report #71 the Board recommended that the tankers CULPEPPER and SALVATOR be acquired and manned by Navy crews. Later, local civilians (Icelandic and Danish) were found to be available to man these ships. Reference (b) directed they be recruited for this purpose. The Board, therefore, withdraws its recommendation made in paragraph 10 of Report #71 and recommends that the CULPEPPER and the SALVATOR remain on allocation.

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- In reference (c), the Commander in Chief, United States Fleet, requested the conversion of a suitable vessels to a Communications Headquarters Ship (AGC) to be completed in the first quarter of 1944. It is recommended that a Maritime Commission C-2 Hull #291, building at Moore Dry Dock Company, San Francisco, California, be acquired by bare boat charter for this conversion and if Maritime Commission Hull #291 is not available that a similar hull be acquired.
- The Board, in Report #54, recommended for acquisition the DASHING WAVE, TYPHOON, and the YOUNG AMERICA. Later, and after a conference between representatives of the War Shipping Administration and the Navy Department, these vessels were allocated to the Navy on a voyage basis. Because the need for additional Navy-manned troop transports for operation in combat areas is most urgent, reference (d) recommended the acquisition on bare boat charter of three (3) ships, the PRESIDENT POLK, PRESIDENT MONROE, and DELBRASIL, in lieu of the DASHING WAVE, the TYPHOON, and the YOUNG AMERICA. The Board considers that the necessity for transportation of troops and military cargoes direct to combat areas requires additional Navy-manned tonnage. The three vessels recommended in reference (d) are larger, faster, and available at once. The Board recommends, therefore, that the Navy acquire by bare boat charter the PRESIDENT POLK, PRESIDENT MONROE, and the DELBRASIL in lieu of the DASHING WAVE, TYPHOON and YOUNG AMERICA; that the ships be Navy manned; that minimum conversion to accommodate a Navy crew be accomplished; and that the Board's recommendations as approved in Report #54 to acquire the DASHING WAVE, TYPHOON, and YOUNG AMERICA be cancelled.
- In District Craft Development Board Report #29, the Secretary of the Navy approved the construction of thirty (30) 2000-ton steel cargo barges of Bureau design and in reference (e) the Vice Chief of Naval Operations directed the construction of ten (10) of these barges, which is the limit of the facilities and material at present available without interference to the building program now underway. Auxiliary Vessels Board Report #69 as approved provides for the conversion of two (2) EC-2s to Internal Combustion Engine Repair Ships (ARG). It is recommended that two (2) of the ten (10) cargo barges mentioned above be converted to Barrack Ship Transports (APL) to house the repair parties assigned to these two Repair Ships. Their conversion is separate and in addition to the barrack barges referred to and provided for in paragraphs 8 and 9 of Auxiliary VesselsBoard Report #71.

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(APA) and Combat Loaded Cargo Vessels (AKA) now exceed the total numbers provided for by existing construction and conversion programs, and directs that C-3 and C-2 Maritime Commission hulls be acquired for early conversion as an additional program of eight (8) APAs and six (6) AKAs, and for a continuing program of one (1) APA per month and one (1) AKA every two months immediately following. The Board, after consideration of the ships now building by the Maritime Commission, and the conversion workload conditions at both East and West Coast shipyards, recommends the acquisition by purchase of the Maritime Commission Hulls listed below for this conversion program.

References (b), (c), and (d) expressed the urgent need for Net Cargo Ships (AKN) in Pacific operations, to transport and install net defenses in harbors at Advanced Bases before they are occupied by important fleet units. The Board considers that EC-2 vessels are best adapted for Net Cargo Ships; that three (3) such ships are required; and that when not engaged in the above work these ships could be employed carrying other types of cargo. It is recommended, therefore, that the Navy acquire by bare boat charter from the Maritime Commission three (3) EC-2 hulls building by the Bethlehem-Fairfield Shipyard, Incorporated, one each in November 1943, December 1943, and January 1944; and that minimum conversion be undertaken to fit them out as Net Cargo Ships (AKN) and to accommodate the necessary Navy crews.
- Early in 1942 the President directed the Chairman of the Maritime Commission to consider the possibility of building a simple type of aircraft transport for the Navy. In reference (e) the Chairman of the Maritime Commission informed the Navy Department of the tentative characteristics that could be embodied in such ships and proceeded to contract with the Kaiser Company, Incorporated, for the building of fifty (50) aircraft transports of a new design. A series of conferences were held between representatives of the Maritime Commission, the Navy Department, and the Kaiser Company. An agreement was reached on certain changes desired by the Navy. This program is now well under way; the first ship has been delivered to the Navy and it is expected that an average of four (4) ships per month will be built until the program is completed. These vessels were originally designated by the Navy as Auxiliary Aircraft Carriers (ACV). Effective 15 July 1943, the Secretary of the Navy approved a change in designation to Aircraft Carriers, Escort (CVE), a combatant type. As all fifty ships will be retained by the United States Navy, it is recommended that they be acquired by purchase from the Maritime Commission as they are completed. Because all authorized combatant tonnage has already been obligated, it is necessary in order to acquire these ships that they be charged against auxiliary tonnage, the classification intended at their inception, and the Board so recommends.

- According to reference (a) certain difficulties have been encountered in manning the SS ATLANTIDA with a civilian crew. This vessel under Honduran registry and flag is allocated to the Navy for use as an anti-submarine training ship. Because of these difficulties and for security reasons, the Board recommends that the SS ATLANTIDA be acquired under bareboat basis by the Navy for use as a training ship; that it be manned by a Navy crew; and that it be designated as an Unclassified Auxiliary (IX).
- In Report No. 73, the Board recommended that title to two (2) C2-S-AJI type hulls be acquired from the Maritime Commission with delivery to the Navy in January and March, 1944 for conversion to General Stores-Issue Ships (AKS). It has been brought to the Board's attention that there is an urgent need at this time for fast troop transports and that the C2-S-AJI hulls requested can be so used. The Board considers that EC-2 hulls can be satisfactorily converted to General Stores-Issue Ships and it is therefore recommended that title to two (2) EC-2 hulls be acquired from the Maritime Commission in lieu of the two (2) G2 hulls recommended in Report No. 73; that necessary conversion to General Stores-Issue Ships (AKS) be accomplished; and that they be manned by Navy crews.
- The Commander Service Squadren, South Pacific Force has recommended that temperary repairs be made at Espiritu Santo to the MATHEW LYON and the M.H. de YOUNG, torpedo-damaged liberty Ships, to permit their use as dry cargo storage ships in the South Pacific. The Board recommends that these vessels be acquired on bareboat basis for this purpose and be manned by Navy crews.
- The Commander, U.S. Naval Forces in Europe requested in reference (e) that the SS PRESIDENT WARFIELD, now at Appledore, Devonshire, England, be acquired for use as a barracks ship. This vessel was originally assigned to the British Ministry of War Transport under Lend-Lease. The Board recommends that the SS PRESIDENT WARFIELD be acquired under bareboat basis for use as a barracks for Naval Personnel and be designated as an APL (Auxiliary, Barracks Ship).
- 7. In Report No. 60, the Board recommended the acquisition of six (6) small coastal tankers (Tl-M-Al) building by the Maritime Commission. Two similar tankers under construction by Todd-Galveston Dry Dock, Inc. (Successor to Gray Iron Works) at Galveston, Texas are understood to be available for Navy acquisition with estimated deliveries in January, 1944. In view of the increasing need for such vessels, the Board recommends that title to these two tankers be acquired from the Maritime Commission by the Navy and that they be converted to provide for Navy crews and to permit the

transportation of both gasoline and diesel oil.

- 8. By reference (f) the Commander, Alaskan Sector expressed an urgent need for additional transportation facilities in his sector and recommended that the SS YALE, which has been used as a floating barracks and mess hall for contractors' personnel and later as a receiving ship at Kodiak, Alaska, be placed in an operating status. Inasmuch as it has been determined that the vessel is in good material and mechanical condition and suitable for the purpose requested, the Board recommends that the SS YALE be placed in commission as the IX-106. (This vessel was acquired 30 April 1943, date that the Bureau of Yards and Docks closed out contract NOy 3570, and was assigned the name U.S.S. GREYHOUND).
- In Report No. 72, the Board recommended the acquisition of certain C3 and C2 Maritime Commission hulls for an immediate conversion program of eight (8) Attack Transports (APA) and six (6) Attack Cargo Ships (AKA) and for a continuing program of one (1) APA per month and one (1) AKA every two months immediately following. In that report a total of twenty-five vessels was listed as available for acquisition. It is now ascertained that twenty-six C3 and C2 hulls can be acquired from the Maritime Commission program for that purpose. It therefore, is recommended that one additional C3 hull building at Ingalls Shipbuilding Corporation be acquired by transfer of title to complete a conversion program of 15 APA's and 11 AKA's in 1944.

- (b) Commenting on this request, ComTwelve submitted a list of five (5) EC-2 freighters which had been converted by WSA to carry about twelve hundred (1200) officer and troop passengers. In view of the limited time available for further converting these vessels to the standard Navy AP, the Board recommends that these vessels be taken under allocation and be continued with their present crews.
- (c) Similarly, ComTwelve recommended the names of ten (10) EC-2 freighters for conversion to AK's referred to in subparagraph (a). The Board recommends that five (5) vessels immediately available be acquired under bareboat basis from WSA, be converted to Cargo Ships (AK), and be manned by Navy crews including boatmen and stevedore gangs. Navy personnel, suggesting that twelve (12) officers and six (6) additional CPO's and thirty (30) enlisted men would be sufficient. It was further stated that no conversion incident to such manning would be necessary. The Board concurs in these recommendations and accordingly desires to modify paragraph 3 (b) of Report No. 76 with reference to taking five (5) XAP's under allocation and to recommend that four (4) transports, namely, JAMES H. McCLINTOCK, JOSIAH D. WHITNEY, NATHANIEL J. WYETH, and RICHARD MARCH HOE, be acquired from WSA on bareboat basis and be manned with Navy crews with no conversion of any kind to be undertaken. In Report No. 75, the Board recommended the acquisition of ten (10) EC-2's to meet the demands for additional cargo vessels and for towing facilities in the Pacific area. These vessels were to be taken on a bareboat basis at the rate of about two (2) per month beginning in October as a continuation of EC-2 conversions. Subsequently, the Commander-in-Chief, U.S. Pacific Fleet requested that eleven (11) EC-2's be acquired as early as practicable for use by Commander, Third Fleet as Navy manned AK's with facilities

for transporting about 1000 troops on short hauls in order to relieve regular Transports now being retained in the area for that purpose. In view of the priority of this requirement and the large number of conversions involved, it is now recommended that in addition to the ten (10) EC-2 hulls covered by Board Report No. 75, only six (6) more be acquired on a bareboat basis from WSA. Of the sixteen (16) vessels, which will be taken at the rate of about four (4) per month beginning 10 November, 1943 it is further recommended that the first eleven (11) be converted to AK's without towing engines and include facilities for transporting about 1000 troops on short hauls and that the remaining five (5) ships be converted to standard Navy Cargo Ships (AK) with towing engines.

- In Report No. 79, the Board recommended the acquisition of three (3) EC-2 hulls for conversion to General Stores-Issue Ships (AKS) in order to partially meet a request of the Commanderin-Chief, U.S. Pacific Fleet for such vessels. In reference (a), it was indicated that two (2) old cargo vessels would be acceptable for meeting part of this requirement. The Board understands that the old motorships CITY OF ELWOOD and WARD are available for acquisition although it is recognized that they are in very poor material condition with unreliable engines and are little more than hulks. The Board recommends that these vessels be acquired from WSA on bareboat basis after delivery by WSA at a port in the Pacific area designated by the Commander-in-Chief, U.S. Pacific Fleet; that they be manned with Navy crews after acquisition; and that they be designated as Unclassified Auxiliaries (IX). It is also recommended that the Navy request WSA to provide such minimum conversion as can be accomplished in ten (10) days to include installation of shelving, cribbing and binning plus a makeshift depreservation room and crating facilities but that no repairs or alterations for accommodation of naval crews be undertaken.
- 5. A representative of the Bureau of Ships stated to the Board as follows:

"There still remains a working balance of 95,758 tons unobligated in authorized auxiliary tonnage. The Bureau, however, has received directives for 318,204 tons of auxiliary tonnage over and above legislative authority, but these ships in this tonnage are being built by the Maritime Commission and have not been delivered. Delivery can not be accepted until additional auxiliary tonnage authority has been obtained."

The Board is cognizant of the fact that additional legislative authority has been requested in the amount of 1,500,000 auxiliary

COMMITMENT

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Administration approved the assignment of this vessel to the Navy under bareboat basis "as is where is" and by ref (c) Com7thFleet was authorized to accept the S/S WILLIAM WILLIAMS. The Board therefore recommends that the foregoing action be approved, to wit, delivery of the S/S WILLIAM WILLIAMS "as is where is" by WSA under bareboat basis, transfer to Australia for repairs and conversion to an Auxiliary Cargo Ship (AK-135) to be Navy manned and assigned to Com7thFleet for duty in Service Force, 7th Fleet.

- By ref (d) it was requested that six (6) concrete cargo barges (B7-D1 type) under construction by Barrett and Hilp, Belair Shipyards, San Francisco be acquired with conversion by the builder to provide facilities for carrying and issuing general stores at advance bases. The Board understands that the U.S. Maritime Commission will approve this request. It is recommended therefore that title to six (6) of the earliest available B7-D1 type concrete barges be transferred to the Navy upon their completion including conversion features as recommended by ComServPac, that they be manned by naval personnel and be classified Unclassified (IX).
- In Report No. 80, the Board recommended that in addition to the ten (10) EC2 hulls covered by Report No. 75 that six (6) more be acquired on a bareboat basis from WSA for conversion to AKs 114-123, incl., 129-134, incl. The first eleven of these sixteen hulls are to be converted to include facilities for transporting about 1000 troops on short hauls and will be temporarily assigned to Com3rdFleet. The remaining five EC2's (AK 130-134, incl.) will receive the usual AK conversion features (including towing engines) with assignment to NTS. As approved by JMTC and agreed to by the WSA member, five (5) C-type cargo wessels will be made available to the Navy for Troop Transports to be manned with naval crews which will replace five EC2 type vessels originally authorized by Report No. 75. The Board was advised that WSA had already nominated the S/S COMET and S/S JOHN LAND (C2 types) for assignment to the Navy. It is recommended, therefore, that these two vessels and three equivalent C type vessels be acquired from WSA on a bareboat basis after their conversion by WSA to carry troops, that they be manned by naval crews as early as practicable and that as their operations permit they be made available for improvements and alterations to bring them up to Navy standard AP's. These five vessels will be classified as Troop Transports (AP).
- By ref (f), CinCPac reaffirmed previous requests for ten (10) cargo ships to be navy manned with 5 converted to AP's and 5 to AK's with the proviso that their acquisition should not interfere with current conversions of AK 114-123, incl., 129. The Board was advised that JMTC interposed no objection to conversion of five cargo vessels to Troop Transports with resulting loss in cargo lift and that the WSA member indicated that C type vessels could be made available in lieu of EC2's. The Board recommends that five (5) C3, C2 or C1 type vessels (in order of preference) be acquired from WSA under bareboat basis as soon as facilities are available for their conversion by the WSA to Troop Transports (AP\*). Similarly, it is recommended that five (5) EC2's be acquired from WSA under bareboat basis for conversion

to Cargo Ships (AK). It is further recommended that suggestions contained in ref (e) pertaining to modification in conversions of cargo vessels be observed where practicable in order to expedite this work.

By ref (g) the Board was advised of War Department's request for Navy to provide crews for fifteen EC2 cargo ships for use in the Southwest Pacific in combat and forward areas. Reference further recommended that conversion be kept at a minimum and that landing craft would not be required. These vessels are in addition AK 93, 99, 102, and 104 (temporarily assigned) and AK 135 (ex WILLIAM WILLIAMS) which will be permanently assigned to Com7th Fleet upon completion of repairs. It is further understood that these fifteen vessels will release, on a ship for ship basis, WSA vessels allocated to the Army now retained in that area. The Board indicated that retention of these vessels under merchant crews would have to be continued for some time due to the work now underway and in immediate prospect at conversion yards. The Board recommends that fifteen additional EC2's be acquired from WSA under bareboat basis as conversion facilities become available, that they be provided a minimum conversion to accommodate naval crews and be assigned to Com7thFlt for duty in Service Force, Southwest Pacific.

8. A Bureau of Ships' representative advised the Board regarding auxiliary tonnage as follows:

"There still remains a working balance of 78,391 tons unobligated in authorized auxiliary tonnage. Delivery cannot be accepted until additional auxiliary tonnage authority has been obtained."

The Board noted that legislative authority had been requested by ref (h) for 2,500,000 additional auxiliary tonnage.

- 3. The Board reviewed the 2000-ton steel barge construction program as authorized in previous Board Reports, at present totaling 68- YF's and LAAPL's.
- Due to the present shortage of Auxiliary Tenders in the Fleet, the Board considers that some of those now in service should have their capacities augmented as soon as practicable by providing additional Floating Barracks Barges to permit certain repair ships and tenders to perform work on a shift basis. It is therefore recommended that 6 of the 68 YF's now authorized be constructed or converted as APL's and that 9 additional barges be constructed as

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APL's. This will provide a total of 29 APL's, 23 of which the Board recommends be completed in 1944 (8 to be used with ARG 2-9 incl. and 15 with the large tenders as recommended by reference (a)).

- 6. As of 15 November 1943 Commander—in—Chief Pacific Fleet requested that two additional vessels be acquired for use as barracks ships at Advanced Bases. Request for two vessels similar to the M/S YOMACHICHI (covered by Report No. 76) has been approved by War Shipping Administration. The Board recommends that the motorships CITY OF DALHART and TAMPA be acquired under bareboat basis be converted to Barracks Ships (IX) and manned by naval crews.
- 7. A Bureau of Ships representative advised the Board regarding auxiliary tonnage as follows:

"Tonnage authority for Auxiliary Vessels Construction or Acquisition in the amount of 2,500,000 tons has been made available by the Act of 17 December 1943 (Public Law 204, 78th Congress). When implemented by contract authority in the Deficiency Appropriations Bill, which has not yet become law, and pending clearance by the President for the portion of the 2,500,000 tons to be used at this time, this tonnage authority can be obligated for vessels programs. The Bureau has received directives for 478,459, tons of Auxiliary vessels to be placed against this new Act, after allowing a balance of 3,986 in the last 1,000,000 tons authority".
