The Board recommends that these 64 vessels be acquired by transfer of title from the Maritime Commission upon their completion as Cargo Attack Ships (AKA) and Transport Attack Ships (APA).

By reference (c), the Joint Chiefs of Staff requested that the Maritime Commission construct 130 standard APA's and 30 standard AKA's for the Navy for completion as early in the fourth quarter of 1944 as practicable. By reference (d), the Commission advised that Western Pipe and Steel Company, San Francisco, would build 4 APA's and Ingalls Shipbuilding Corporation, Pascagoula, Mississippi, 7 APA's. The balance of 119 APA's are to be constructed by the following yards:

36 - Oregon Shipbuilding Corp., Portland, Oregon

34 - California Shipbuilding Corp., San Pedro, Calif.

27 - Kaiser Company, Vancouver, Washington

22 - Kaiser Company, (Richmond #2), San Francisco, Calif.

The 30 AKA's will be built, 24 by North Carolina Shipbuilding Corporation, Wilmington, North Carolina, and 6 by Moore Dry Dock Company, Oakland, Calif. The Board recommends that these 130 Transport Attack Ships (APA 106-235-incl.) and 30 Cargo Attack Ships (AKA 64-93 incl.) be acquired from the Maritime Commission on a loan-charter basis upon their completion.

- By reference (e), the Joint Chiefs of Staff requested that the Maritime Commission build 100 small freighters for use by the Army and Navy and agreed that one design would meet the requirements of both services. In reference (f), the War Department requested that Navy man 25of the 50 vessels assigned to the Army. 3. It has been recommended by reference (a) that a building program of six (6) ASR's be authorized to replace five (5) obsolete "Bird" class ASR's and ASRII which was recently lost. It is understood that this program will not have a high priority as the object is to get the new vessels into service gradually. No increase in personnel is involved as the additional ASR's are replacements. Only four (4) of the nine (9) ASR's on hand are suitable for Submarine rescue activities -- the other five (5) are converted "Bird" class AM's. An additional ASR is being converted from new construction AT hull.

- 5. The foregoing vessels provide a length of 4,377 feet. The Board considers it most desirable to make up the deficit by acquiring four (4) additional B7-Al type concrete barges upon their completion at Savannah, Georgia, provided obsolete dry cargo vessels of equivalent length cannot be obtained earlier.
- 6. The Board was informed that arrangements had been made to load the six (6) concrete fuel barges at Baytown and Port Arthur, Texas with Navy special fuel for discharge enroute to destination and to load the first available dry cargo barge with Bureau of Yards and Docks equipment at Oakland, California.
- 7. In view of the ultimate use of these vessels, the Board recommends that they be acquired from present owners chargeable against "Funds for Construction of Advance Bases" under the cognizance of the Bureau of Yards and Docks. It is further recommended that the vessels be provided with naval crews, as required.

As suitable obsolete dry cargo vessels are not available for this project, the Board recommends that the five remaining concrete barges under construction by MacEvoy Shipbuilding Corporation, at Savannah, Georgia, namely CONCRETE Nos. 6, 9, 10, 11 and 12 be acquired upon their completion. Consequently, reference (c) requested that the Maritime Commission deliver APA's 151-156 inclusive to the Navy, at a suitable stage of construction, as Victory Cargo Ships for conversion to Naval Hospital Ships.
- 4. As a result of conferences and discussions by the representatives of the Navy Department, War Department, and the Maritime Commission, an agreement has been reached whereby, instead of allocating six (6) hulls intended for APA's that six (6) of the C4-S-B2 type under construction at Sun Shipbuilding and Drydock Company will be made available to the Navy for conversion to hospital

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ships. Reference (d) further advises the Joint Chiefs of Staff that six (6) of the hulls authorized for APA's by reference (a), namely, MCV hulls 147-152 inclusive (APA 181-186 inclusive) would be built instead as Merchant Cargo vessels (Commission design VC2-S-AP3).

- 5. The Board therefore recommends that Board Report No. 84 be modified by reducing the number of APA's being acquired from the Maritime Commission from 130 to 124, which decreases the number of hulls from Oregon Shipbuilding Corporation, from 36 to 30. This will cancel the construction and acquisition of APA 181-186 inclusive.
- 6. The Board further recommends that MC hulls 743-748 inclusive now under construction by Sun Shipbuilding and Drydock Corporation for the U. S. Maritime Commission be acquired from the Commission, at a suitable stage of construction, on a loan basis and be converted to naval hospital ships (AH 12-17 inclusive); and that they be manned by naval personnel.
- 7. The Board noted that no increase in naval personnel is involved by the cancellation of six (6) APA's and acquisition of six (6) vessels for AH's in their place.

3. 2 Operating tankers for use as mobile floating storage (IX)

Two (2) of the tankers acquired under authority of reference (c) for fuel storage were subsequently converted instead to AWI and AW2, respectively. - 5. The Commander-in-Chief, Pacific Ocean Areas has been informed by reference (c) that in accordance with his recommendation, no conversion features will be provided on these vessels and that there will be accommodations for a maximum complement of only 14 officers and 76 enlisted men.
- 6. In view of the urgency of this request which involves planned operations, the Board recommends that ten (10) VC2-S-AP2 type hulls be acquired from the Maritime Commission on a loan basis as completed merchant vessels, that they be outfitted by the Navy and be provided minimum naval crews necessary for efficient operation. It is further recommended, in accordance with references (b) and (c) that no conversion be accomplished.

7. A representative of the Bureau of Ships advised the Board that prior to this meeting there was a cleared balance of 95,008 tons available for Auxiliary tonnage with an additional 300,000 tons not yet cleared by the President for general use.

In response to reference (a) covering the above request, it is understood that the Maritime Commission proposes to have four of these Oilers constructed at Marinship Corp., Sausalito, Calif., according to T2-SE-A2 design and five at Sun Shipbuilding and Drydock Co., Chester, Pa., according to T3-S2-Al design.
- 5. The Board recommends that the four Marinship tankers be built similar in design and characteristics to AO 93-96 class and the five Sun tankers similar to AO 97-100 class, that upon their completion they be acquired from the Maritime Commission on a loan basis, be manned by naval crews and be placed in commission in the Navy.

- 4. Reference (b) authorized the acquisition of 10 P2-SE2-Rl type troop transports (MC Hulls 678-687 incl.) on a lean basis from the U.S. Maritime Commission for AP 120-129 incl. The Board was informed that in response to request by the Chairman, U.S. Maritime Commission, the Joint Chiefs of Staff have indicated their approval that the last two of these vessels now under construction at Bethlehem-Alameda Shipyard Inc., namely, MC686-687 (AP 128-129), be re-designed and constructed as passenger-cargo ships (P2-SE2-R3) in order to provide for some commercial operation of this type vessel soon after the termination of the European War. Accordingly, the Board recommends that acquisition of the foregoing vessels be cancelled and that reference (b) be so modified. The personnel thus released should be credited to "CAZ vessels".
- 5. In view of the shortage of Repair Ships (AR) in the Pacific Fleet which has been accentuated by recent repair and upkeep requirements, reference (c) indicated the desirability of retaining AR's 19, 20 and 21 for this service and not assigning them to a foreign government. Mobile Storage Tankers

- 3. The Commander in Chief, Pacific Fleet and Pacific Ocean Areas has indicated a need for additional storage tankers for use in the Pacific theater. Three vessels considered suitable for this purpose and which have outlived their usefulness as commercial tankers have been nominated by War Shipping Administration, namely: S/S PENNSYLVANIA at Portland, Ore., for ultimate use as storage for fuel oil and S/S DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA and S/S UTACARBON, now at San Francisco, for storage of gasoline and/or diesel oil. It is understood that three more vessels will be named in the near future.
- 4. The Board's attention was invited to the provisions of reference (c) in which the Chief of Naval Operations indicated that vessels of this type were not expected to meet Navy standards nor to be converted or repaired to make them do so; that it was expected that they would be in good operating condition sufficient to make the voyage and on arrival in the forward area,

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be capable of receiving cargoes from trans-Pacific tankers and capable of discharging such cargo to other craft as required at anchorage; that if necessary they would be sustained by base facilities or other naval vessels present; and that they would be manned with a minimum of personnel consistent with carrying out their mission at anchor and utilize existing berthing, messing and sanitary facilities.

5. The Board recommends that the foregoing vessels or their equivalent and three other suitable vessels be acquired from the War Shipping Administration on a bareboat basis upon their arrival at Pearl and that they be placed in commission as Unclassified Auxiliaries (IX) for assignment to Service Force, Pacific for use as mobile floating storage for liquid cargo.

Dry Storage Vessels

- 6. The Commander, Seventh Fleet has indicated that a damaged liberty ship named the DON MARQUIS would require extensive repairs in order to make it ready for towing back to the mainland and that with the approval of the War Shipping Administration's representative in the area, engine and deck equipment had been removed for use on other vessels so that operation under its own power was questionable. In view of the foregoing and due to the higher priority of naval ship drydocking in that area, Commander, Seventh Fleet requested that the vessel be acquired by the Navy for use as floating dry storage.
- 7. The Board recommends that the DON MARQUIS be acquired "as is" from the War Shipping Administration on a bareboat basis and following repairs be placed in service as a non-self-propelled Unclassified Auxiliary (IX) for the above use.

- 8. Reference (d) also indicated that the motor vessel UNICOI, due to its age and condition, was unfit for long voyages. However, it was considered suitable for mobile dry storage in the area and the War Shipping Administration representative indicated approval for its transfer.
- 9. The Board recommends that the M/S UNICOI be acquired from the War Shipping Administration on a bareboat basis, be manned with naval crew not to exceed complement of five officers and sixty-five enlisted men, and be placed in commission as an Unclassified Auxiliary (IX).

This request was reiterated in reference (b) which indicated that S/S DOMINO, authorized by Auxiliary Vessels Board Report No. 99, typified the type of vessel desired. (Similar merchant vessel in this status is the M/S UNICCI, authorized by Board Report No. 100, and naval vessels PEGASUS (AK48) and Tackle (ARS(T)4) which will be reclassified (IX).

- The S/S ELINOR WILEY, a Liberty ship built by the Maritime Commission, which suffered extensive underwater damage in October 1944 and which subsequently returned to the United States after major repairs had been effected in a foreign port, has been offered to the Navy for employment as dry cargo storage.
- The Board recommends that this vessel be acquired from the War Shipping Administration on a bareboat basis upon arrival in the forward area, be manned with Naval personnel and be commissioned as an IX for mobile dry cargo storage. In view of the vessel's structural weakness, the Board recommends that the Commander, Service Force, Pacific be cautioned not to overload the ELINOR WYLIE and not to employ the vessel on continuous voyages for dry cargo transportation.

S/S EDWARD L. DOHENEY for floating fuel storage (YO). 6.

By reference (c), the Commander in Chief, Pacific Ocean Areas indicated that the tanker EDWARD L. DOHENEY would be acceptable in a nonself-propelled status, classified (YO), for use as floating fuel storage at Eniwetok provided that due consideration was given to the vessel's pumping equipment and habitability for complement similar to YO-164, and provided that the vessel was delivered to destination under her own power.

- In considering this request, the Board referred to previous correspondence concerning this vessel wherein the Sub-Board of Inspection and Survey. Eighth Naval District, by reference (d) recommended non-acceptance for use as mobile floating storage because of the ship's generally deteriorated condition and poor state of repair; to reference (e), wherein the Commander in Chief, Pacific Ocean Areas indicated that he did not desire the DOHENEY in a hulk status, and to reference (f), wherein the War Shipping Administration indicated that the present tanker position would not justify removal of tankers from the operative fleet for floating storage which were in better condition than the DOHENEY.
- The Board is of the opinion that since the Commander in Chief, Pacific 8. Ocean Areas is cognizant of this vessel's condition and status but notwithstanding is willing to accept her, sufficient repairs should be effected by the War Shipping Administration to fit the vessel for voyage to the Pacific for ultimate use for dead storage of fuel oil, these repairs to include:
 - (a) Tanks, pumps and piping placed in condition to efficiently store and handle black oil.
 - (b) Ground tackle overhauled and placed in efficient condition.

By reference (b) the Chief of Naval Operations advised the Commander in Chief, Pacific Ocean Area that the War Shipping Administration was agreeable to the Navy taking over these vessels. By reference (c) Commander Service Force, Pacific was requested to take necessary action to determine the details of damage and to arrange for their repair.

4. This vessel being in the Port of Bremerhaven before the general capitulation of Germany, was seized in prize by U. S. Navy. In view of the facilities, labor and equipment available at Bremerhaven, the conversion, reconditioning and repairing of this vessel has been initiated and is currently being accomplished by North German Lloyd under the supervision of the War Shipping Administration. Technical assistance of naval personnel under the Commander, U.S. Naval Base, Germany has been made available. Plans for converting this Ex-German passenger liner to carry about 10,000 troops have been submitted by North German Lloyd and approved by the War Shipping Administration with certain modifications.
- 6. In view of the EUROPA's ultimate status as a Naval Transport, the Board confirmed the reservations stated in reference (f) with regard to the conversion and recommends that:
 - a. The naval crew be provided with adequate and satisfactory accommodations, berthing, messing and sanitary facilities.
 - b. Troops be provided with adequate and satisfactory messing and sanitary facilities, access and life-saving equipment.
 - Navy be consulted regarding stability, sub-division and sea-worthiness after conversion and that adequate safety features be incorporated.

- Reference (a) requested that steps be taken to acquire title to two (2) Maritime Commission built refrigerated cargo ships and to compensate for the Naval crews required by inactivating two (2) ADRIA Class AFs. This request is based on post-war requirements for two (2) fast, fully-refrigerated ships for point to point transportation of frozen provisions to Pacific Bases.
- The presently planned post-war AFs consist of: 4.

(a) ALDEBARAN (AF10), HYADES (AF28), and GRAFFIAS (AF29). (b) SATURN (AF40) - presently owned by WSA, title requested

5. The two (2) vessels under consideration are presently under Navy allocation operating with merchant crews. Such allocation must terminate 30 June 1946 in order to avoid payment of charter hire. These ships were included in a group of six (6) which the Joint Chiefs of Staff, under date of 6 June 1944, (JCS 896) requested the Maritime Commission to include in its 1945 construction program. The following information is pertinent:

- 6. The Board was informed that sufficient personnel to man the OCEAN CHIEF and GOLDEN ROCKET could not be realized by decommissioning two (2) ADRIA Class vessels. However, one ADRIA Class plus the SATURN would provide sufficient complement for both new ships. It was suggested that existing request for transfer of title to the SATURN be withdrawn as this vessel is an Ex-German ship having special type boilers, the replacement of which will require expensive and extensive alteration to the ship's structure.
- 7. The SATURN (AF 40) may remain in naval custody until 30 June 1946. The ADRIA Class ship selected for assignment to inactive fleet should report not later than 31 August 1946.
- 8. The Maritime Commission has indicated that favorable action would be taken on Navy's request for transfer of title to these two (2) vessels.
- 9. The Board, therefore, recommends that title to the OCEAN CHIEF (247,687) and GOIDEN ROCKET (248,207) be acquired from the War Shipping Administration/U.S. Maritime Commission prior to 30 June 1946, that only necessary voyage repairs be effected without major alterations or change in existing accommodations, that they be manned by minimum naval crews sufficient only to operate these ships in the transportation of bulk refrigerated cargoes for the logistic supply of bases, and that they be commissioned in the Navy, classified as Provision Store Ships (AF).



of the foregoing, only the GRAFFIAS, ALDEBARAN, and HYADES are suitable for fleet issue and/or issue at sea. The AISTEDE and ZELIM having the same speed are open hold reefers without insulation between levels of the holds and are suitable only for carrying refrigerated cargo in bulk for complete discharge by holds. The eight ADRIA Class are suitable for fleet issue in port, but their slow speed militates against their usefulness in serving fleet units. The three GRAFFIAS Class have brine coil refrigeration, all of the others obtain their refrigeration by means of air cooling systems, which restrict temperature control and limit the extent of compartmentation.

- 5. The Board reviewed the recommendations in references (b) and (c), which summarized are to the effect that:
 - (a) Commander, Service Force Pacific recommends replacement of five ADRIA Class with three large fast reefers fitted for fleet issue and conversion of the AISTEDE and ZELIMA for fleet issue in two phases, the first phase to provide for issuing at sea and the second to make them fleet issue ships.
 - (b) Commander, Service Force Atlantic recommends replacement of two of four ADRIA Class with two large fast reefers fitted for Fleet issue.

Both Commander in Chief Pacific and U.S. Pacific Fleet and Commander in Chief Atlantic and U.S. Atlantic Fleet concurred in these respective recommendations.

- 6. Reference (d), in reviewing the situation, concluded that five ADRIA Class should be replaced with three large fast reefers fitted for fleet issue as soon as funds could be made available for such conversions.
- 7. The meeting was adjourned pending further investigation by technical bureaus of reactivation and conversion costs.

- 9. The Board was informed that a superficial examination of the POLARIS (Ex-AF-11) disclosed that vessel was in good condition in spite of two years in deferred disposal status in the Maritime Commission's laid-up fleet in Suisun Bay. This ship has Sun-Doxford main engines, is fitted out for fleet issue and would cost about \$300,000 to \$500,000 and require 130 working days to reactivate after recovery from the Commission.
- Recovery of the SATURN (Ex-AF-40) was not considered practicable in view of the IaMont boilers installed whose replacement would be difficult and expensive; high maintenance costs due to German auxiliaries and lack of spare parts; and replacement cost of electrical equipment.
- design bulk reefer would be about \$1,500;000 and require 180 working days. There are four of these ships available owned by the Maritime Commission and chartered to American operators. They were built in 1945 and have the same characteristics as the AISTEDE and ZELIEE. The same cost and time would be involved in converting older Maritime Commission owned reefers having similar characteristics: 6 C2-S-Bl design built in 1943, including 1 laid-up; 4 C2-SU design built in 1942, including 1 laid-up. The cost of converting a straight general cargo ship such as a Victory type was estimated as \$2,000,000 to \$2,250,000 and 262 working days. There appeared to be no particular advantage in considering the latter case except the utility gained by installation of a brine coil system for better temperature control and compartmentation. This type of conversion was employed in the AIDEBARIN, GRAFFIAS, HYLDES, PCLARIS and SATURN which were originally general cargo ships.
- 12. The Bureau of Ships stated there were no funds available to accomplish the tentative program recommended by Commander, Service Force, Pacific Fleet.

- Following a discussion of facts bearing on the problem, the Board recommended that:
 - (a) Disposal instructions on the POLARIS (Ex-AF-11) be cancelled and this vessel be recovered from the Maritime Commission, be repaired, and reactivated, placed in commission and assigned to Commander in Chief Pacific and U.S. Pacific Fleet, for duty in Service Force, Pacific; provided that funds are made available from the 1949 Supplemental Maintenance Bureau of Ships appropriations as passed by Congress.
 - (b) If and when the POLARIS is recovered, two ADRIA Class AF's now assigned to the Commander in Chief Pacific and U.S. Pacific Fleet be decommissioned and declared surplus to the Maritime Commission for disposal.
 - (c) The further conversion of the ALSTEDE and ZELIM as recommended by Commander, Service Force Pacific Fleet and endorsed by the Commander in Chief Pacific and U.S. Pacific Fleet, be disapproved at this time due to lack of funds.
 - (d) When funds are available, two R2-S-BV1 design reefer ships be acquired, and two ships of this type (either the two acquired or the AISTEDE and ZELIMA) be altered to fleet issue reefers.
 - (e) If these two ships are acquired, to assign one to the Commander in Chief Atlantic and U.S. Atlantic Fleet, replacing two ABRIA Class AF's and one to commander in Chief Pacific and U.S. Pacific Fleet, replacing the remaining three ADRIA AF's. These five ADRIA Class to be declared surplus to the Maritime Commission for disposal.
